My dearest fellow Neffers:

To paraphrase the Most Interesting Man in the World, "I don't always read *The N3F Fan Gazette*, but when I do, I prefer Vol. 6 #2." If the *Gazette* is a retitled *FanActivity Gazette*—and it is, since last September!—I like the name change. A lot. And I don't mean the parcel of land. Checking my records, the last time I wrote a letter of comment to this august fanzine (well, this is July) was in early 2025.

It is encouraging that Mindy's health challenges have taken a turn for the better. May you heal fully and quickly. It's also good news that publishers are sending you—or the N3F—books to review. I remember managing the review section when I edited *The National Fantasy Fan*; receiving materials from publishers to redistribute to reviewers was a joy. I also remember wondering how and whether to assign later volumes in a series—people didn't always request such books—but sometimes a book works as a standalone and you don't need to start at the very beginning. (Although that's a very good place to start.) Generally, my advice is: Read the book you're with.

"I feel like I'm slacking and failing to get reviews out in a timely manner," you wrote. That can be a challenging sensation, but you don't really have to review everything you receive. Materials are sent to be *considered for review*—or, at least, that should be your offer as an editor—even if our goal is to read and review All the Things. (After all, that is the goal, if we want ongoing review copy service from publishers.) Don't let a neverending To Be Read pile feel overly daunting. That way lies inactivity and frustration rather than fanac and fun. If fanac isn't fun, we're doing it wrong.

It is Lloyd Penney's letter of comment that inspired me to prioritize writing the *Gazette* sooner than later. Instead of focusing my attention on materials received so far this month—that's what I do so I don't feel bad about not stomping all the wahfles—I'm dipping into July's items to make good on the, oh, so good feeling of my ears burning. It is so flattering that people talk about me in the pages of fanzines! I don't know if that's ever happened before. Since we moved to Portugal last October, I paid attention to the World Cup for the first time ever in my life. I never watched an entire game, but I monitored the results and scores, reading the sports newspapers and magazines. Football—what I used to call

soccer—is a Very Big Deal here. I’ve yet to start collecting cadernetas e cromos—stickers—yet, though a new set just came out, I think.

In his letter, Lloyd wrote, “On page 4, I saw a listing for Heath Row in Culver City, CA. Heath and his wife have emigrated to Portugal, so I guess that address isn’t good any more. I know the California fans keep in touch with him, but I don’t know his new address.” It’s true! We moved to Portugal last October and now live in the countryside inland from Porto and Braga in the north. My current contact information is below, and you can probably stop running the request for contributions to *The Stf Amateur*. I stopped publishing the *Amateur* in December, though back issues remain available at <https://efanzines.com/HR>. Instead of the *Amateur*, I now publish this correspondenzine, *Wahflestomper*. I’ll send you the Manifesto, as well, so you get a sense of what I’m trying to do with this new project. I also co-edit a newszine focusing on science fiction, fantasy, and horror in Portugal—in Portuguese—called *Notícias de Pfandom*. We’ve published four issues so far, and the fifth will come out in the weeks to come. Most of the back issues can be found at https://fanac.org/fanzines/Noticias_de_Pfandom, and the most recent issue is available at <https://tinyurl.com/Pfandom-4>. Regardless, thank you very much for helping draw attention to the *Amateur*. I really appreciate the support and encouragement. Publishing those 27 issues was one of the most rewarding fanzine experiences I’ve had in my time as a faned. (Editing the *Fan* was another.) Thank you, also, to Lloyd, for making my ears burn. That was Very Cool.

In addition to the *Gazette*’s name change, I really like its current focus and direction. Your concentration on fanzines is awesome: notable items, new releases, and information straight from the pages of other fanzines. Do you plan on introducing fanzine reviews? Because of the unfortunate death of Guy H. Lillian III last year and the end of his reviewzine *The Zine Dump*, that might be an interesting opportunity. His presence and involvement is much missed.

Walter Bruce Sinclair’s book release information—aha: White Dwarf Books!—is also very useful. That’s one of the best resources I’ve encountered, so kudos for reprinting it. In Sydney, Australia, Galaxy Book Shop (<https://www.abbey.com.au/abbey/about-galaxy-bookshop.do>) is similarly excellent for new release information.

It’s good to see that Jason is continuing to maintain the Science Fiction Pro and Fan Birthdays calendar. You could consider grouping that with the other calendar material. (Just an idea, but the pub nights and holiday grid could be grouped with this and the con listing. It’s all so very helpful!) One day, we should make a concerted effort to update the birthday calendar with more recent authors and fen. This issue of *Wahflestomper* is hereby dedicated to Brian Aldiss, who was born on this date in 1945. May all books be as good as his books.

Hip, hip, hooray for the *Gazette*! What a wonderful issue—and what an excellent fanzine. I should make reading this more of a habit—even if I don’t always show up in the letter column.

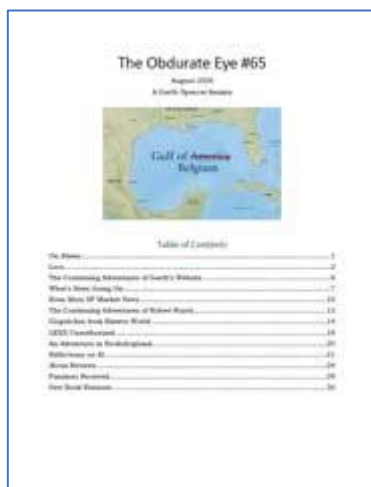

Fans Rally to Save *Stargate*

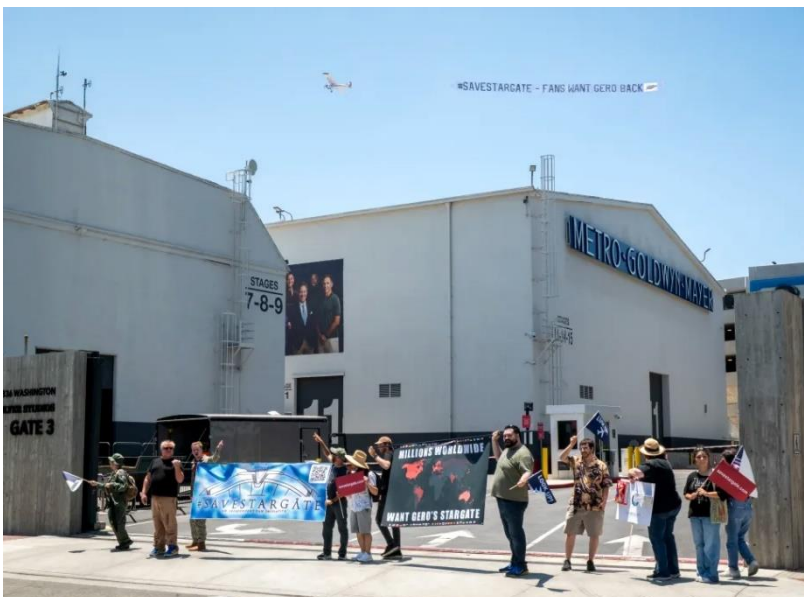
When Amazon spent \$8.5 billion to acquire MGM in 2022, speculation ran rampant about what that would mean for the franchises owned or distributed by the studio – *The Pink Panther*, *RoboCop*, *The Handmaid's Tale*, *Fargo*, the James Bond films, the *Rocky* films, among others.

But the one that touched off a lot of chatter: *Stargate*. The 1994 film, starring Kurt Russell and James Spader, had been independently produced by Roland Emmerich and Dean Devlin and distributed by MGM. Three years later, Showtime debuted *Stargate SG-1*, picking up the story a year later with Richard Dean Anderson and Michael Shanks taking the roles of Jack O'Neill and Daniel Jackson. After five years, the show was picked up by the Sci Fi Channel, spawning two additional series, *Atlantis* and *Universe*, along with various tie-in media, short online series, and a series of made-for-TV movies.

For three years, online discussions would frequently bubble with anticipation and curiosity as to whether or not Amazon would reboot the show, do something with the franchise. After all, it was a highly successful program with fans around the world. Word had it that veteran *Stargate SG-1* producer Brad Wright had been lobbying Amazon to revive the show, to no avail.

Then, in November 2025, *Stargate* fans got the news they'd been hoping to get for a good long while: show veteran Martin Gero would be running a new *Stargate* series set in the same continuity as the existing franchise. Together with other veterans from the shows, Gero planned to continue the story instead of rebooting the entire thing from scratch. A writers room was assembled, aided by veteran writer/producer Joseph Mallozzi, and the show went into pre-production.

Then, after an executive churn at Amazon, the show was suddenly and unceremoniously cancelled. It seemed the new managers in charge felt that the show in development would appeal to ... existing fans? Well, isn't that how it's supposed to work? Apparently, not so. It wasn't broad enough, according to an article in *Deadline*. Pattern recognition set in, and many started to suspect that *Stargate* was about to get "reimagined for the modern audience" – a certain death sentence that has befallen almost every other major SF franchise in the past fifteen years.

Reactions were swift and decidedly in support of Gero and his team. The hashtag #SaveStargate began popping up all over social media. A letter-writing campaign was organized. It worked for *Star Trek* twice, and fans figured it would help in this instance as well. (See also *Jericho* and *Cagney & Lacey*.) Social media posts also started tagging cast and crew from the various *Stargate* shows. Michael Shanks, who played Dr. Daniel Jackson, quickly added his voice to the cause, as did David Hewlett (Dr. Rodney McKay), Mallozzi, Robert Patrick (Col. Sumner), Tori Higginson (Elizabeth Weir), David DeLuise, and Joe Flanigan (Col Sheppard).

Fans organized petitions, the largest one now over 118,000 signatures and counting. Fans from all over the world have rallied with the hashtag, organizing

“tweetstorms” on Twitter/X. And as Amazon MGM posted promotions for other shows, fans answered with posts turning the marketing message back to focus on *Stargate*.

Posters and banners have been brought to San Diego Comic-Con International, as well as other events in the UK and Europe, gathering signatures from fans. James Kerfoot organized a GoFundMe campaign and hired a plane to fly a banner over the Amazon MGM offices in Culver City, California. With an initial goal of just \$4,000 to cover expenses, the campaign raised over \$11,000. Kerfoot told the news site *GateWorld*, “The #SaveStargate campaign has already brought in new fans to the franchise who are experiencing the joy of *Stargate* for the first time. We know that Martin Gero has what it takes to continue this show in the right way, and we stand behind him and his team.”

Other fans bought ad space in Times Square, with messages appearing on various video screens throughout the day in the heart of New York City. The message included the rallying cry, “Help us reopen the iris!”

There have been meetups, watch parties, comic-con panels, online discussions, and more as fans rally together now going on 70+ days since the cancellation was announced.

To date, there has been no public response from representatives at Amazon MGM, although writer/producer Kamran Pasha has quoted, via his Patreon page, a source inside Amazon that says

discussions have been had at a high corporate level to determine how to proceed in the wake of such strong fan activity. From that report, it would seem that the new bosses have to determine how to un-cancel the project without embarrassment.

Fans have saved shows before. It remains to be seen whether they will save this one.

- **Ahlborn, Ania. *The Unseen*. Gallery, 26.00 tp.**

Isla Hansen, a mother reeling from a devastating loss, is beside herself when a mysterious orphan appears on the outskirts of the Hansens' secluded Colorado property. Although strange and unexplainable, the child's presence breathes new life into Isla. But as they settle in, Isla's husband, Luke, and their five children notice peculiarities that hint at something far beyond the ordinary - anomalies that challenge the very fabric of reality itself.

- **Anders, Charlie Jane. *Lessons in Magic and Disaster*. Tor, 27.99 tp.**

Jamie is basically your average New England academic-in-training. She has a strong queer relationship, an esoteric dissertation proposal, and inherited generational trauma. But she's also a powerful witch. Her mother Serena has been hiding from the world in an old one-room schoolhouse for several years, grieving the death of her wife and the simultaneous explosion in her professional life. So, Jamie's busy digging into a 300-year-old magical book, but she still finds time to teach Serena to cast spells and help her come out of her shell.

- **Anson, Marvellous Michael. *Firstborn of the Sun*. Penguin UK, 21.99 tp.**

Yoruba-inspired fantasy. In the Kingdom of Oru, power lies in agbara: the ability to harness the sun. Only young L'ore has no agbara. A fact she must conceal from everyone - including best friend Alawani - on pain of death. When the gods declare Alawani a High Priest - the Gods' servant - he faces a terrible trial likely to kill him. Unwilling to lose her friend, L'ore vows to save him. But as she does, a forbidden shadow magic pours from her hands.

- **Aragon, Jesse. *The Demon Star*. DAW, 39.00 hc.**

When Ysira's estranged son is chosen to become the vessel of a god-killing demon, she is faced with a choice. Allow him to harness cosmic power at an unspeakable cost, or doom millions to save him. She finds an unlikely ally in Brother Jacen Kheris, once a gifted exorcist, now a guilt-ridden addict, desperate for purpose. From a demon-haunted canyon to a starbound satellite, they must battle their way through cultists, aliens, and the gods themselves.

- **Araki, Akane. *Murder at the End of the World*. Pushkin Vertigo, 23.95 tp.**

A meteor is on a collision course with Earth. The entire human race has 3 months to live. Uncontrollable panic has set in across the globe, but 23-year-old Haru is still determined to finally get her driver's license. When Haru and her ex-cop driving instructor Isagawa open their car trunk one day to find the corpse of a murder victim inside, they feel duty-bound to investigate. Together, they set off on a road trip through the crumbling landscape around them to hunt for the killer.

- **Arena, Brittney. *To Dance With Death*. [*The Edge of Glass* #2]. Random House Canada, 38.00 hc.**

Once a dancer, now a disgraced princess on the run, Vasalie Moran is caught in the middle of a war between Miridran and Brisendale, her father on one throne and a cursed King Anton on the other. Desperate to tame powers she never wanted, Raven makes a pact with her aunt Delilah: In exchange for learning to control her magic, Raven will capture one of the spirits that roam Delilah's hometown on May's Eve so that it may grant Delilah's secret wish.

She just needs to get through one boring ceremony, inherit her earth magic, and return home. Instead, she's handed a dagger and with it, an impossible choice.
